

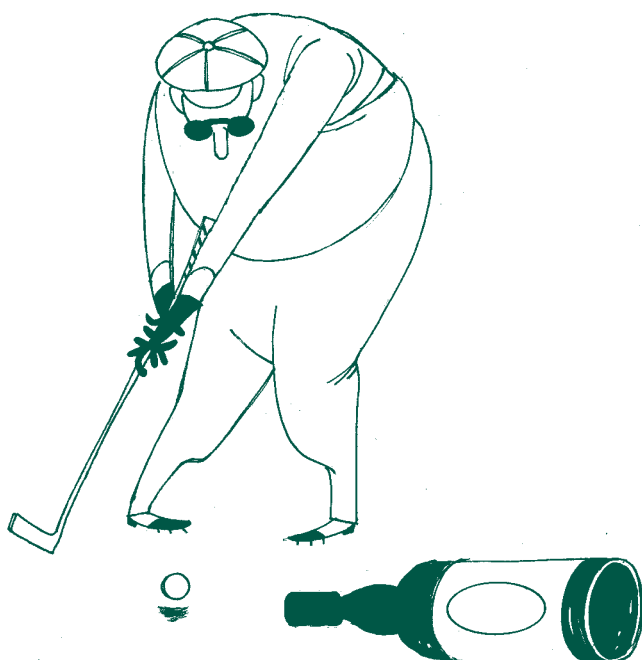

<i>Springtime in a glass</i>	36.66	The nose was light, even elusive, but we eventually discovered the fresh heart of it – grassy meadows, pear, crisp white wine, light candy, pine, strawberry tart, spring flowers, elderflower cordial, apples, heather and gorse – springtime in a glass; bright, floral and refreshing. The taste conformed to the nose, up to a point – we found fruit salad chews, pear belle Hélène, gooseberry and dry white wine – but there was more of a duality, for we also got liquorice, honey-roasted nuts, nutmeg, dark chocolate and mouth-drying tannins. Water brought out menthol and mint – fresh as a mountain stream tumbling down from Speyside’s mountain.					€ 83 S 36.66 € 4.14

<i>Refreshing Elderflower Fizz</i>	85.27 Lossie	The fruity notes are dominating to start; peaches, ripe melons and pineapples but very soon sweeter aromas appear with white chocolate ice cream, limoncello and a refreshing elderflower fizz with a delicate minty note. The taste neat is still fruity but with a drying, slightly chalky mouth-feel. Pear biscuits, cooked pineapples, grapefruits - all with a dusting of icing sugar. With water, crystallized fruits in Tutti Frutti ice cream, lavender and lily of the valley, reminding some of a lady’s powder compact. The taste is now very floral with an elegant perfume scent; a chic and sophisticated example from this distillery 3 miles south of Elgin still using worm tubs to cool the distilled vapours.					€ 141 S 85.27 € 6.13

<i>Sweet, tart and spicy</i>	37.56	Fruity aromas flitted around like moths at lit windows – candied orange and lemon, gooseberry, apple Danish and fruity sticks of rock; also crème brûlée, cinnamon-flavoured bubble-gum and forest floors. The neat palate was sweet and tart at the same time (apple sours, rhubarb rock, fresh rhubarb dipped in sugar); but with good sprinklings of spice (pepper, chilli, mulled wine spices). In reduction, the nose became spicier (fennel, aniseed, pepper) with marmalade, dried fruits, lemon meringue pie and tobacco. <i>Charcuterie board in a carpenter’s workshop</i>	63.29	We all moved into a carpenter’s workshop with warm, deep and woody aromas of chestnut, cedar, pine, oak and cinnamon bark. At the same time wood shavings, glue, felt tip pens and a glass of freshly pressed apple juice. The taste turns the juice into Calvados, very mouth coating and moreish with a pleasant semi dry finish combined with the chewy sweetness of blackcurrant wine gums. Adding water, still plenty of aromatic wood besides tobacco and banana leaves and a quince jelly. The taste is now more oriental wood, alongside a well brewed Lapsang Souchung tea accompanied by a charcuterie board served with oatcakes.					€ 126 S 63.29 € 5.61

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<i>Sweetness gently tickled by oak</i>	71.39 Lossie	The nose had a sweet centre-piece (caramel chocolate biscuits, marzipan, marshmallows) around which lay scattered floral perfumes, sharp fruits, cherry-scented tobacco, polished furniture, sherbet dib-dabs and spicy lamb tagines – pleasant and complex. Water turned it more floral for a while, eventually resolving in fruity pleasures (marmalade, Demerara on grapefruit) – really rather seductive. The neat palate’s definite oaky spice (chorizo, leather, pepper, nutmeg, coconut) was balanced by fruit, flowers and sweetness – Green & Black’s Maya Gold came to mind. <i>Full, complex and reassuring</i>	64.43 Lossie	The nose had an odd but attractive assortment of perfumes – Tiger balm, putty, menthol, eucalyptus, pine and tobacco; sushi pickled ginger or Jamaica cake; tea, malt loaf and blueberry muffins – full, complex and somehow reassuring. The unreduced palate was big, sweet and spicy – lots of variations on chocolate ginger biscuits; Madeira sponge, stewed apples, Demerara and sweet tobacco. The reduced nose somehow combined Green & Blacks ginger chocolate and Turkish Delight with linseed oil, Swarfega and church incense. <i>‘Oh How Joyfully’</i>	35.101	A gentle and soft aroma to start, almost shy, but it heightened our expectations of what was to come. Making baked apples with brown sugar, cinnamon, chopped pecans, currants, raisins and sultanas as well as anise-flavoured cookies, a smell of pine needles and wood sap from a fresh cut fir tree – happy childhood memories of the night before Christmas. It is a waxy, oily, honey mouth coating texture with flavours of sandalwood, resin and exotic spices. With water there is a hint of wood smoke followed by candied orange and lemon peel, dried fruits and cardamom. <i>A little dab'll do ya</i>	7.85	Quite a nose prickle to start, green unripe apples but then becoming warm and homely like a comfort blanket; sweet, slightly smoky, dried tobacco, barley sugar and a malted milk hot chocolate. The taste neat had something best described as 'old fashioned'; antique chest of draws with dusty old maps and thick leather bound books, coconut coffee hobnobs and grandad's Brylcreem. Adding a little water, 'use more only if you dare', a single matchstick lighting a cigarette, an old well- worn Tweed jacket and liquorice all sorts. The taste reassuring and yet again comforting; oaky, leather sofas and sweet smoke tobacco. <i>Honey and flowers in a knicker drawer</i>	48.31	The rich, rewarding nose delivered marzipan, caramel, chocolate digestives, Battenberg cake, honey and beeswax polish; someone detected floral incense, someone else a tin of Lakeland pencils and the Lady-poet was rummaging in her knicker drawer. The unreduced palate had velvety chocolate and Mayan cocoa – also buttered toast, caramel and salty toffee – then light, sweet smoke, woody notes, pepper and chilli. The reduced nose produced more cereal notes (honey nut clusters) syrup, bread dough and green leaves. <i>A grand old lady in the piano shop</i>	76.117	Our dame opened her perfumed leather handbag to find rum truffles and cherry liqueur chocolates. She was off to take tea with hot cross buns, chocolate orange fudge gâteau, and fairy cakes with glace cherries. The setting was a piano shop and she sat perched on a red velvet stool, in an old waxed jacket. A drop of water lifted the tea leaves. Mead, sultanas and warmed malt loaf with Millionaires shortbread. With time some prosciutto and salted caramel emerged. <i>Sweet and sour creative tension</i>	44.56	The nose had heaps of honey, mounds of marshmallows and vast vanilla it also evoked summer barbeques (charred ribs, salad, lemon, balsamic, wood-sap, lawns) and a bookbinders workshop (leather, paper, glue). The palate had sweet and sour creative tension – sweet vanilla, chocolate muffins, crème brûlée, dark toffee and fudge against stewed fruits, Haribo sours, orange and blueberry. We also found woody notes – oily pine and wood fire embers. The reduced nose offered millionaire's shortbread, sweet pipe tobacco, shrubberies and a good blast of honeycomb; while balsa wood and clove joined the palate. <i>Fruits in a toolbox</i>	64.39	This nose had multiple layers and development phases – scorched heather, coal and toolboxes co-existed with fresh-cut limes, orange, cherry, apple, cinder toffee, muesli and Pastrami ham. The palate also displayed fruity aspects (redcurrants, peaches, plums, ice wine) along-side toffee, smoke, ash and 'charcoal dipped in caramel'; we found it dry but with sweetness not unlike dessert wine. The reduced nose became rich and interesting – Danish pastries, pork with apple sauce, nutmeg, clove and old leather-bound books. <i>Magical, mellifluous marvelosity</i>	73.62 Deveron	The nose conjured up a classy gentlemen’s’ club (leather armchairs, oak panelling, cigars, black tea, Jamaica cake); also dark cherries, orange peel and rum-soaked raisins. The palate had delicious, spicy depth – golden syrup, toffee, marmalade, honey and espresso, before cinnamon and ginger tingled us right to our tonsils. The reduced nose was sweet, woody and smile-inducing – happiness flooding over the panel like maple syrup or butterscotch sauce over pancakes – a magical, mellifluous marvelosity. The reduced palate was elegant and refined, with honey fudge sweetness and spice cake temptations destroying any attempt to remain unimpressed. <i>Zesty Ginger-Lime Cooler</i>	1.176	The initial nose neat has the freshness of green saplings and cut grass soon followed by fruity notes of apricots and peaches. With time deeper aromas of old fashioned rose water perfume are taking centre stage. The taste starts off similar to the nose; green and grassy, slightly cereal (Weetabix) and then fruity (now apple slices). The medium length finish is refreshing like a ‘Zesty Ginger-Lime Cooler’. With water we are preparing a fruit punch with strawberries, pineapple, peaches and cherries. The taste is hot and fiery – the battleship is in action – or we take a break from gardening on a sunny afternoon and enjoy rye bread dipped in olive oil. With water we take a rest sitting in a wicker chair on a warm cedar decking surrounded by pots of sage and heather. All of these are engulfed in perfume like being in a ladies powder room with fresh cut lilies in the corner. The taste is that of red fruit jam, brown butter cranberry gingerbread cakes, chocolate raisins all mixed together with wood spices and oak tannins. With water it is like an explosion in the kitchen making jam, sweet notes of marzipan and Turkish delight. <i>Salivating sweetness; savoury whispers</i>	77.32 Northern	Salivating sweetness hit the nose – panellists listed Twix, golden syrup, toffee éclairs, walnut whips, honeycomb, marmalade on toast, marzipan, iced gingerbread and treacle; we also identified pineapple, plum, dates and orange blossom, all on freshly polished wood. The palate had generous ginger, orange peel, tobacco leaf, perfumed candles, coffee grinds and assorted chocolates. With water, sherbet, refreshers and lemon drizzle cake arrived on the nose – hot-cross buns suggested Easter but clove and honey-roasted ham whispered Christmas. Yes, there was peat-smoke on the palate too – but it was also surprisingly sweet, with caramel wafers, drinking chocolate, fondant, brioche and ginger cake, before developing more masculine, meaty flavours. The reduced nose gave us cocoa-dusted chocolate truffles and sweet pastries against rye bread, lemon, sweet smoke and sage and marjoram. <i>In the Spanish mountains</i>	123.8 Western	From the nose, we conjured an image of Spanish mountain villages – horses, hay-wains, orchards, citrus groves, rose gardens, sunshine on rosemary and rustic farm-labourers whittling wood. We also found plentiful sweetness in plum jam, juicy raisins, chocolate, toffee, marshmallows and fig rolls. Water brought out raspberry notes and Sangria. The palate was fruity, winey and tasty, with various jams, dried figs, vanilla sponge, Soreen and granola, but spicy notes of ginger, clove and chilli tweaked our tongues. Delicate floral notes mingled with pine resin and pastry notes. The spice level at full strength was like licking sandalwood polished with linseed oil. With water, plum sauce and more exotic spiciness developed. Pomegranate seeds and pencil boxes. The palate flavoured us with waxy paper, cakes, golden syrup, honey on toast, pink sushi ginger, lemon pepper, juniper and pine. With water, the nose found swimming pools, flip-flops and a rocket salad dressed with lemon and balsamic. The palate absolutely chimed with its years – complex and flavourful, with light smoke, charred oak and aromatic spices (cinnamon, pepper, coriander seed, fennel seed) balanced beautifully against exotic fruits, fig rolls and brandy snaps. The reduced nose found honey, lychee, melon, pineapple and sherbet straws, with darker shades of Hoisin duck, pepper and faint smoke. The palate was a big, impressive combination of sweet, spicy, smoky and briny, with leather and ash – panellists identified sweet balsamic strawberries, Bombay mix, harissa, Toffees, vanilla, coffee, cigarillos, moules marinières and pork sausages. <i>Wasabi on a California Roll</i>	53.198	An image of an old derelict wooden pier by a pebble beach on a hot sunny day with ageing lobster pots. Fresher notes appear with time; steamed fish with spring onions, fennel, sage and thyme. The taste is crispy clean, salty and herbal, peach and lavender butter on sourdough bread and a cup of Earl Grey tea. With water aromas of slightly burnt salty pretzels, sun dried tomato bread and pistachio-crust fish with a lavender honey sauce. 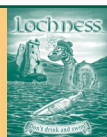
